

## Dance (BFA)

The dance program at Brenau has traditionally sought to balance professional preparation of the highest caliber with the development of the student as a whole individual. It is this tradition that gives the program the impetus to set goals of increasing excellence. The intent of the dance program is not only to provide the most professional program possible for majors but also to foster appreciation of movement and of the dance aesthetic as an integral part of education.

## Program Highlights

A degree in dance performance shall consist of 79 hours in dance major and related courses. Command of a broad range of movement idioms coupled with depth in at least two areas of technique are essential accomplishments of BFA students. In addition, courses in choreography, production, pedagogy, dance history, and courses related to the major give background and depth to students' knowledge of the art form. The dance performance track offers students the option of refining skills for the stage acquired in technique classes. Performing gives the students the background and experience to begin making works of their own.

#### Financial Aid Procedures

While, financial aid can only be awarded to students who have been officially admitted to the university, it is best to begin the process as soon as you apply for admission. You will be notified of your acceptance by official letter from the Office of Admissions.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on the Web at <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>. If you are completing FAFSA on the Web for the first time, we recommend that you (and a parent if you are a dependent student) apply for a PIN at <a href="www.pin.ed.gov">www.pin.ed.gov</a> prior to completing the FAFSA. With a PIN, you are able to electronically sign your application, make corrections after submitting the application, review your processed application data, and add other institutions to receive your application results. Brenau's school code is 001556.
  - If you prefer to complete a paper FAFSA download one at  $\underline{www.federalstudentaid.ed.gov}$ . Just click on FAFSA Filing Options.
- 2. Apply for the Georgia Tuition Equalization Grant and the HOPE Scholarship if you are an undergraduate student and have been a legal resident of Georgia for a minimum of twelve consecutive months. You may complete and submit this application online at <a href="https://www.gacollege411.org">www.gacollege411.org</a> by clicking on the Applications and Transcripts tab and then selecting GSFAPPS. This will require you to create an account and a profile if you have not already done so. You may also print the application, complete it, and forward it to the Office of Financial Aid.
