Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.

Electives: Electives are not listed on the program plan by the Admissions Office, however all courses are posted to the student's transcript. Electives needed for graduation can be calculated simply by:

The total number of hours on the student's transcript
(available in CampusWEB)
- hours earned for courses taken at the developmental level
+ courses currently registered for
+ courses still outstanding.

A minimum of 120 undergraduate semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with a bachelor's degree. After completing liberal education and major requirements, if the total number of hours on the student's transcript is not at 120, then the student must take enough general elective hours to reach a cumulative total of 120 hours. If a course is repeated, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so that they are not short hours at graduation. Due to placement, a student may graduate with more than 120 semester hours.

Undergraduate Residency requirement:

A residency requirement of 30 undergraduate semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with this combined degree.
